# Restorative meeting

**victim, perpetrator, mediator,  
crime, repair**



The victim and the wrongdoer meet with an impartial adult to discuss and find a solution.

# Restorative circle

**meeting, structured, affected,  
circle, incident, solutions**



All the people affected by an incident meet in a circle to discuss what happened and find solutions together.

# Victim

**person, damage, harm,  
actions**



The person who has been hurt or lost something because of someone else.

# Perpetrator

**person, committed, crime,  
damages**



The person who did something wrong or illegal and hurt someone else.

# Reparation

**actions, compensate, repair,  
damages, victim**



Actions to repair or compensate for damages caused by the wrongdoer.

# Reintegration

**process, reintroduced,  
accepted, community, held  
accountable, repaired**



The wrongdoer is accepted back into the community after taking responsibility and repairing the damage.

# Responsibility

**admission, assumption,  
perpetrator, facts,  
consequences**



The person who did the harm recognizes his actions and their consequences for the victim and the community.



# Empathy

**ability, understand, feel,  
emotions, experiences,  
person, process**



The ability to understand and feel what another person is feeling, essential to the restoration process.

# Community

**group, persons, affected,  
incident, crime**



The group of people who are directly or indirectly affected by an incident or crime.

# Restorative Justice

**approach, justice, reparation,  
damage, victims,  
accountability, perpetrators,  
involvement, parties**



An approach to justice that focuses on repairing the problems caused to the victims and holding the perpetrators accountable by involving all affected parties.

# Facilitator

**Person, neutral, leadership,  
process, restorative, parties,  
heard, safe, constructive**



The neutral (neutral) person who helps lead the repair process, ensuring that all sides are heard and that the process is safe and constructive.

# Restorative agreement

**understanding, plan, victim,  
perpetrator, mediator, repair,  
damage**



The plan that the victim and the wrongdoer reach, often with the help of a mediator, to fix problems and prevent further wrongdoing.

# Restorative conference

**process, formal, victim,  
persons, affected, meet,  
discuss, incident, solution**



A formal process in which the victim, wrongdoer and other affected people meet to discuss the incident and reach a common solution.

# Moral reparation

**process, recognition,  
expression, remorse,  
contribute, morality, victim,  
community**



The process of acknowledging and expressing regret by the wrongdoer in order to contribute to the spiritual healing of the victim and the community.

# Social support

**support, community, victim,  
perpetrator, help, process,  
healing, reintegration**



Community support for both the victim and the wrongdoer to help with the healing and reintegration process.



# Restorative dialogue

**communication, open, honest,  
understands the impact of  
the crime**



Open and honest communication between the victim and the wrongdoer, with the aim of understanding the impact of the wrongdoing and finding ways to make amends.

# Resilience

**ability, recover, come back,  
experiences, negative,  
traumatic**



The ability to recover and return to a state of well-being after negative or traumatic experiences.

# Material reparation

**compensation, financial,  
reparation, to the victim**



Financial compensation or other material forms of reparation provided to the victim by the wrongdoer.

# Consensus

**general, agreement, parties,  
involved**



The general agreement of all parties involved in the remedial process on a specific solution or action.

# Restoring relations

**process, reconstruction, trust,  
victim, perpetrator,  
community, crime**



The process of rebuilding trust and relationships between the victim, the wrongdoer and the community after a crime.

# Relapse

**behavior, criminal,  
sanctioned, crime,  
reintegration, of the  
perpetrator, community**



Resumption of criminal behavior by a person who has previously been sanctioned for a crime. In restorative justice, emphasis is placed on preventing recidivism by identifying and addressing the root causes of criminal behavior, promoting accountability, reparation, and reintegration of the offender into the community.

# Conflict

**opposition,  
misunderstanding, interests,  
beliefs, resources, goals**



It refers to a state of opposition, misunderstanding, or clash between two or more parties, whether individuals, groups, or nations. It can arise for various reasons, such as differences in interests, values, resources, beliefs or goals.

# Crime

**conduct, action, laws,  
sanction, prohibited,  
penalties**



An action or behavior that violates established laws in a community and is sanctioned by the authorities.



# Mediation

**mediator, communicate,  
solve, dispute, solution**



A process by which a neutral third party, called a mediator, helps two or more conflicting parties communicate and reach a mutually acceptable solution. Mediation may involve a qualified person facilitating discussions and negotiations between other participants to resolve disputes or find solutions to issues under discussion.

# Friendship

**affection, cooperation,  
mutual, loyalty**



A relationship of mutual affection and support between two or more people. Friendship can involve cooperation, mutual help and loyalty between people.

# Volunteer

**initiative, obliged, action,  
external**



To act on one's own initiative, without being forced or compelled by external circumstances.

# Respect

**appreciation, consideration,  
honesty**



To recognize and appreciate the value and rights of other people, treating them with consideration and honesty.

# Communication

**transmit, receive, transmit,  
efficient**



The process of transmitting and receiving information, ideas, and feelings between people. Effective communication can help clarify strategies, resolve conflicts, and make group decisions.

# Forgiveness

**resentment, chance, mistake,  
positive**



Letting go of negative feelings and giving a second chance to someone who has done wrong. Forgiveness can mean moving past conflicts or other people's mistakes and continuing to live in a positive and constructive atmosphere.
